Introducing Our New Grief Care Services


Faithful supporters,

In Memory of TCU Baseball's Youngest Teammate, Superhero Micah Ahern

His life and his legacy define him. The youngest player on the TCU baseball team and TCU's biggest fan — he even had an honorary scholarship — served as inspiration to players, fans and anyone who met him. He loved spending time with his coach and his teammates. At just sixteen months old, Micah was diagnosed with neuroblastoma. You may assume his world would center around cancer, but you would be wrong about Micah. His world was centered around people. He loved people. Micah was a true superhero in every sense of the word. His motto in life was 'Never ever give up.' And even until his last breath, he never did.




After years of chemotherapy, radiation, surgeries and multiple relapses, the goal for Micah's treatment went from curative therapy to living life to the fullest for the rest of his days, with nothing holding him back. For the previous six years, Micah spent countless days at Cook Children's; they became like family. Every day for him was an adventure. In June, when Micah relapsed for the fourth time, his mother Linda heard the words no parent wants to hear. 'There is nothing we can do, it's time to go on hospice.'

Linda knew that it was time for Micah to live the rest of his days to the fullest. He wouldn't have wanted it any other way and that is when the family called Community Hospice of Texas. The family recalls what a gift it was to have Melinda, Micah's nurse, and Kelly, Child Life Specialist, lead their journey with hospice and make the road a little less bumpy. One of the greatest challenges was helping each of Micah's siblings learn how to cope. Linda recalls that working with Kelly, the child life specialist, made this challenge so much more manageable. Kelly came to the Ahern home once or twice a week and counseled with each of Micah's siblings. She loved on them, showed them attention and catered to each of their individual needs. She talked to them about Micah dying and going to heaven. She comforted them when they were mad or sad, and the most important thing she did was to help them let Micah go.

After Micah passed away, Kelly was still there for the Ahern family, visiting the Ahern home to work closely with the children and help them cope. Child life specialists are not considered essential to the insurance company world; they are not a billable service. But thankfully, Community Hospice of Texas considers Kelly and others like her to be invaluable in a family's journey through death, loss and grief. The Ahern family is grateful for Community Hospice of Texas for serving their family.
