All About Hospice Social Workers

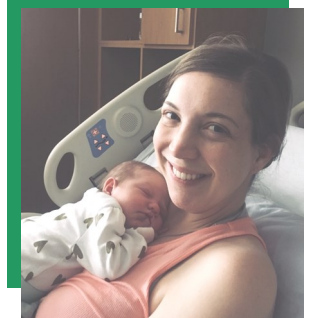
- Provide therapeutic/emotional support, education and resource information to patients and their families.
- Advocate for patient's needs/wishes with team members, family members, caregivers, and other providers.
- Assess the psychosocial needs of patient and family members
- Provide therapeutic counseling and emotional support to patients and family members and education on end of life issues

All About Palliative Pathways Coordinators

- Work closely with physicians of patients who are not yet ready or appropriate for hospice but need additional support
- Provides support services and community resources
- Conducts community education and/or in-services to educate the community on programs available to assist patients and families as they navigate a life-limiting illness.
