Patients and families who are coping with a life-limiting illness have practical issues to deal with:

- Business decisions
- Advance care planning
- Estates and wills
- Funeral arrangements, etc.

They also need time to have meaningful conversations and relationships with loved ones. The psychosocial and spiritual support provided by hospice can be a valuable resource for the patient and the family.

Your goal for your patients is to relieve suffering and assist them to live life to its fullest. An earier referral to hospice means that specialized pain and symptom management can begin earlier, not only managing current symptoms but also preventing others that may occur. You are ensuring optimal quality of life.

The National Hospice and Palliative Care
Organization (NHPCO) 2020 Facts and Figures
Hospice Care in America report found that the
median length of stay for hospice care was
only 18 days even though six months of care
can be covered by Medicare; and more if
medically necessary. At the same time, family
evaluations of hospice care remain high and often
