### **COMFORT**

Medications, medical equipment and medical supplies are provided for comfort and convenience while managing the patient's illness.

The hospice team aims to prevent breakthrough pain and prevent uncomfortable trips to the Emergency Room.

### **IMMEDIATE NEEDS**

Acute pain or symptoms are identified and a plan for management and prevention is developed. Equipment to enhance comfort such as a hospital bed or oxygen is provided.
